### "New Year, New Start"



September is often seen as the start of new things. A new school year, maybe a new school. Off to college, university. The start of a new job.

But sometimes new things can be really exciting and something we want to happen, other times it can be really scary, wondering about what will happen, the unknown. Will we make friends, what happens if the new job doesn't work out?

Why is September the month we start something new? Well as we live in Suffolk, and so are surrounded by farms and farming families, we should all know that after September things guieten down after the business of harvesting. So historically schooling would start

after the autumn harvest where all hands would have been needed on deck.

Prior to 1752 the British calendar started in March. Our financial year starts in April. In Australia the school year starts after their summer holidays in January. The Chinese New Year starts in February. As the Islamic year is not linked to the Gregorian calendar that we follow, it does not come on the same day each year - in 2018 it is on September 12<sup>th</sup>.

The Christian faith teaches us that a new start is always possible. Christians believe that they have a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. He offers the opportunity to make that new start. What is reassuring is that when we are having a difficult time, when we may be in one of those storms of life, Jesus is with us on the boat, and he can calm our storm.

As it says in that famous footprints poem "Lord, you said, that once I decided to follow you, you'd walk with me all the way. But I have noticed that during the most troublesome times in my life there is only one set of footprints. I don't understand why, when I needed you most you would leave me. The Lord replied "My son, my precious child, I love you and I would never leave you. During your times of trial and suffering when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."

For people leaving home and going to college or university it can be a make or break time for Christian faith. Some people give up their faith, others find faith, often encouraged by people of their own age who have a faith. When we are new to the Christian faith we need to learn what it is all about and how it will affect us in our day to day life. So that could involve going to a house group where people read and study the Bible. We all could try one of the groups in our villages like students try new activities during Freshers' week.

When we become a Christian, we start to live in a new reality. "Christianity," wrote Bishop Tom Wright, "isn't about cosy little lessons to make us feel better. It's about what God's doing in the world – what he's already done in Jesus and what he wants to do through us today."

So, whatever this September 2018 brings to you, maybe a new start, maybe continuing to do the same thing, remember that Jesus is with us, by our side, on our boat, ready to help if needed. It could be the time to start something new, join a group and find out more about the Bible and how we can apply it to our lives.

What do we <u>really</u> know about these Bible topics ?

Sessions are fortnightly on <u>Monday September 24<sup>th</sup></u>; October 8th & 22<sup>nd</sup>; November 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. People of faith, agnostics, and atheists are all very welcome.

Tea or coffee and a piece of cake will be available and a warm welcome to all. A small charge of £1 per person, per session, covers costs.

We will consider - What do we really know about . . . .

**Session 1 – September 24<sup>th</sup> - Biblical Topic – ppt. Presentation 1: 'Eden and the origins of life'** – Facts and/or Fiction? Where did the Genesis information come from? Where was Eden? What do we learn from these accounts? **References:** Two accounts: [1. Priestly Source] Genesis 1:1-2:4a; [2. Yahwist Source] Genesis 2:4b-3:24; plus Job 38:4-36

**Session 2 – October 8th - Biblical Topic – Discussion 1: 'The Apostle Paul's Teachings'** – Why are Paul's beliefs different to those of the Jerusalem church? Did he say slavery was okay or not? Did he believe marriage was no longer acceptable? What did he say about food? **References:** 1 Corinthians 7:1-40; 1 Corinthians 8:1-13 & 11:7-34; Ephesians 6:5-9; Colossians 3:22–4:1

**Session 3 – October 22<sup>nd</sup>- Biblical Topic – ppt. Presentation 2: 'The Biblical Apocrypha and the Maccabees'** What is the Apocrypha? Is it part of the Bible? Who were the Maccabees and how did they uphold the laws given by Yahweh? What do they have to do with Jesus? **References:** The Biblical Apocrypha, commentaries, footnotes & appendices in your Bible

**Session 4 – November 5<sup>th</sup> - Biblical Topic – Discussion 2: 'Women and the Church'** –What was the role of the female followers of Jesus? What was Paul's view of the role of women? Did women hold positions in the early Church? **References:** Romans 16:1-16; 1 Corinthians 11:2-16; 1 Corinthians 14:33-38; Ephesians 5:22-33; 1 Timothy 2:9-15

**Session 5 – November 19<sup>th</sup> - Biblical Topic – ppt. Presentation 3: 'Exodus – the Ten Plagues'** When are the plagues said to have occurred? Did they really occur? What did they mean to the Pharaoh Rameses? **References:** Deuteronomy 6:28-12:42

Session 6 – December 3<sup>rd</sup> - Biblical Topic – Discussion 3: 'What do you know about Jesus Christ and his Life? Fun Quiz. References: The New Testament
