"BUSY, BUSY, BUSY"

(Luke chapter 10)



When you receive a new piece of kit – a DIY bed to make up, a new phone, a hire car do you usually say to yourself, 'I've seen one of these before some where – let's give it a go, see how it works?' Or do you put the new kit to one side, sit down with a cup of tea and read the instructions manual?

It has taken me nearly sixty years to put aside the habit of youth and read the instructions before I start the task in hand. I confess to making up the kit, plugging in the radio or driving away with the new car before I ever give any thought to reading the instructions. As a school boy I stuck together the airfix kit and then tried to work out how to put the Spitfire pilot into the plane - difficult when the glue is drying.

While I find the story of the Good Samaritan encouraging I find the story of Mary and Martha difficult. Since Sunday school days I have identified more strongly with Martha. I am naturally a person who gets things done. I am an active learner: Give me a task and I'll have a go, give me a new piece of kit and I'll try it out, give me some ideas and I will play with them. I feel I would be out the back trying to keep the show on the road if Jesus was sitting in my front room talking with my sister.

Martha is devastated to learn that Jesus believes her sister has taken the better part. Martha's cooking, baking, cleaning and active haste, all her worrying and service is of no account. What joy to do all that work and then to be told that your lazy sister is a better person... 'that's the last time I will welcome the preacher and prepare his tea'.....'. He tells me not to be distracted by my many tasks. I would have had far less to do if Mary lent a hand.'

In sitting at the feet of Jesus Mary was taking a huge step. Here was a village girl sitting at the feet of the greatest teacher the world has ever known. Such courage, grace, drive and determination - as St Paul said, 'In Christ there is no bond nor free' -

- gender, race, social status and wealth are of no account.

To my mind the story Luke told of two sisters is not an anecdote that illustrates the competition between passive worship and aggressive fussiness. I do not believe that it illustrates the riches of a contemplative life coming out of the world to be closer to God. I think Jesus warns Martha and all of us about the Busy, Busy, Busy lifestyle that cuts out time for reading, prayer and learning.

If I am honest I would probably be Martha – an activist, a person who gets things done. The world is full of people like me and Martha – Busy, Busy, and more Busy – people who get some things done but get stressed out in the process. We are distracted by our many tasks and sometimes we can become resentful that others are not pulling their weight, doing their share or really supporting us.

To those watching a person reading, a woman praying, a couple practising dance steps, a neighbour stopping to talk or a man walking in the winter sunshine. 'This is not work – they should be getting on with the task in hand.' In effect Jesus told Martha that it didn't matter too much if the tea was late, the carpets needed cleaning or the drains needed unblocking. All these things need to be done but you need also to take time to think, time to pray, time to read, time to dance and time to sing a new song to the Lord.

In the words of that famous 20th century thinker from Hoboken, a small town in New Jersey USA, Mr Francis Sinatra gave us all good advice:

'Do, be; do, be; and do' – yes you heard it from him straight – 'do-be-do-be-do'.

I wish you a good November of being and doing.

On a practical note – take time out to read the instruction manual.

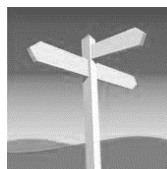
