Will of Henry Broom of Bredfield, son of George and brother to John & Thomas. Henry Broom's Will is dated 30.8.1780 and contains numerous legacies as follows:-

- 1] land & premises at Bredfield in the tenure of William Clarke & Robert Capon to Ann, wife of William Clarke
- 2] £85 to Mary Flory of Tattingsham
- 3] £90 to Hannah, wife of W Curtis of Debach, farmer
- 4] £45 to Elizabeth Swan of Bonhill, widow
- 5] £90 to Susan Cotton of Charsfield, Innholder
- 6] £49 to children of Ann Blomfield late of Dalingho
- 7] £78 to Margaret, wife of John Preston now or late of Ipswich
- 8] £100 to Sarah Broom of Monowden, spinster
- 9] £100 to Martha Broom of Clopton, widow of Thomas Broom which was son of Thomas Broom
- 10] £60 each to children of said Martha Broom
- 11] £100 to Susan the wife of John Upson of Clopton, yeoman
- 12] £100 to Peter Broom of Clopton, yeoman
- 13] £97.18 shillings to Deborah wife of Lewis Cottingham of Bawdsey, yeoman
- 14] £100 to John Broom of Alderton, yeoman
- 15] £90.11 shillings children of Jeremiah Folkard late of Saxmundham, carpenter
- 16] £80 to John Folkard of Framlingham, glover [?]
- 17] £100 to children of Ann Whayman late of Dalingho, widow
- 18] £100 to Elizabeth wife of Edmund Cooper of Sudbourn, wheelwright
- 19] £100 to Mary wife of William Knight of Bredfield, yeoman
- 20] £5 to Henry Blomfield of Dalingho, yeoman
- 21] £5 each to Samuel Weaver [?] and Martha Weaver [?]
- 22] £21 to Edna Woods of Swilland, spinster
- 23] 4 shillings wekly to Mary wife of Robert Birken [?] of Bredfield, labourer.

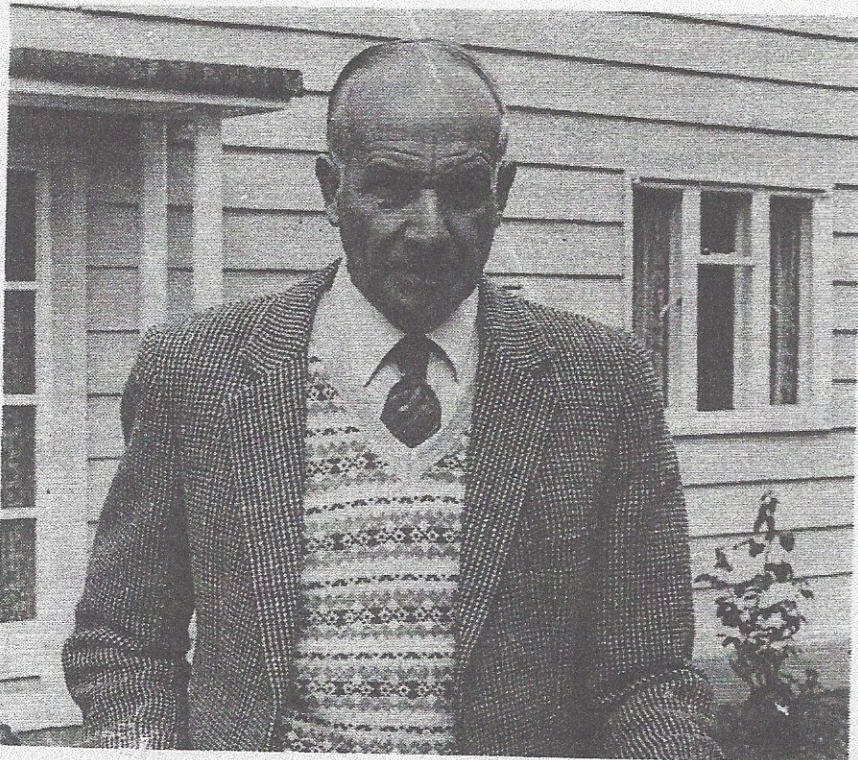
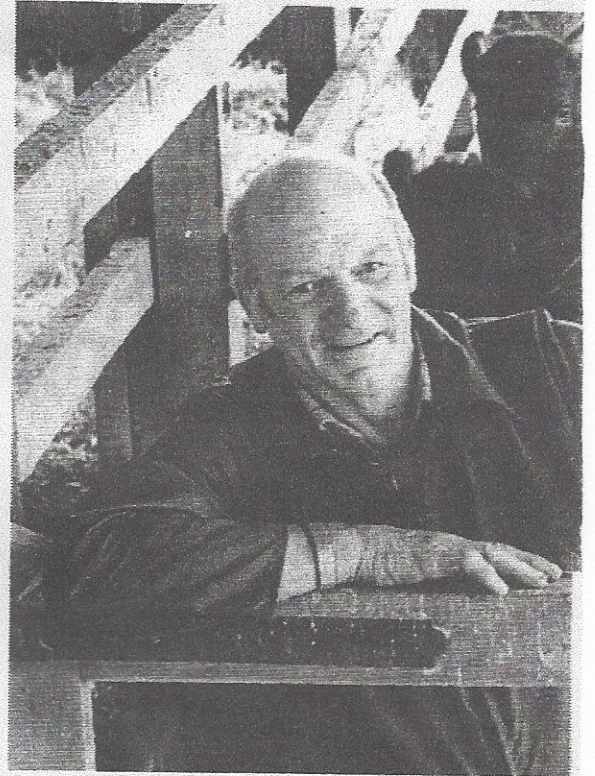
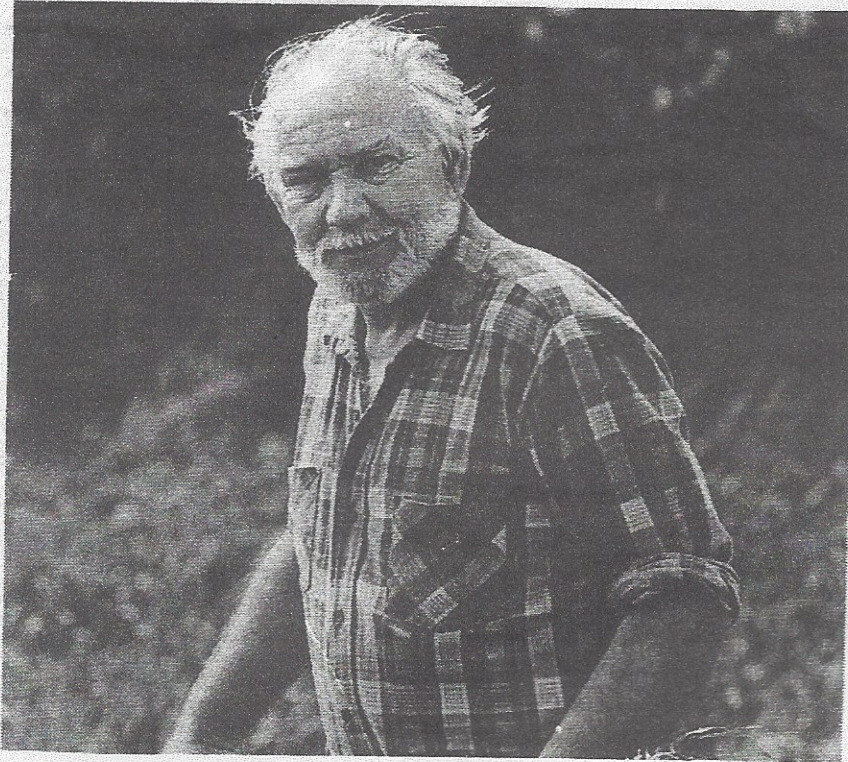
