Kagera

"Life in all its fullness"

Kagera - 'an Anglican diocese in Western Tanzania - the size of Wales'

- Think of a beautiful Savanah country bordering on Uganda, Rwanda and Burundi with rolling hills, rich soil, few towns and no cities (the size of Wales).
- Think of a million people leading a subsistence lifestyle, each family surviving on less than £1 a day growing their crops on allotment style patches of rich soil. A family is rich if they own a cow.
- Think of a country growing ever dependant on foreign aid as the effect of global warming brings the twin disasters of flooding and drought. Traditional farming practice is no longer working.
- Think loss of hope in families where HIV/Aids is a growing problem

Think again - the vision for the church in Kagera is,' Life in all its fullness'. John 10.10.

Kagera may be poor in many of the resources which we ourselves take for granted but the Anglican Church in Kagera is growing and Christians are lifting many communities out of poverty. This is a diocese where Priests are known as pastors. Pastors lead the people in both spirituality and practical ways. For twentyfive years there have been good links between Suffolk and Kagera. We have learnt how the church and community are linked in a process encouraging self-sufficiency. Money raised in Suffolk has gone directly to train pastors who

teach new farming methods and introduce new crops. Global warming has made rainfall less predictable and like Suffolk allotment holders are learning to try new crops and use more mulch.

Pastors in Kagera are paid by the local church. A village church is doing well to raise £4 a week and the Pastor may receive less than £1. His or her allotment provides the food the family will eat. The church in Suffolk helps sixty pastors and nearly three hundred lay evangelists by prayer and generous giving.

Canon John and Frida Buchanimanza recently wrote, "Frida and I would like to record our sincere vote of thanks to you and the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the help of school fees for our children Robert, Sarah and Marimu. May God bless you always?".

Bishops Martin and Bishop Mike are asking the whole Diocese to pray and give generously to Kagera this Lent.

If you enjoy a challenge please consider the Kagera Lent challenge where we can learn more, pray for our brothers and sisters and raise money to help them improve their lives. Some of the challenges are interesting - see Friday 8th March - International Women's day - 'give 50p if you have a female priest in your church, give £1 if you haven't.'

Thank you, or as they say in Kagra Asante sana! - Clare has saved you 50p already.

Letter from The Rector

In Lent this year we are responding to our Bishops request that we explore the relationship between our faith and money – such an exploration was traditionally referred to as a "Stewardship Campaign". Through Lent there will be an opportunity for you to join in a house group; to listen to preaching and to engage daily in reflection and prayer.

Money plays a huge part in our lives: earning it, spending it; worrying about it or ignoring it altogether, but perhaps barely pausing to consider God within our finances. Did you know:

- The Bible has over 2,000 verses about money matters
- Jesus spoke more about money than about heaven and hell combined
- 11 out of 39 parables talk about money
- One out of every 7 verses in Luke's Gospel talks about money

The National Stewardship Advisor John Preston writes:

"There is a story told about some of the Vikings who were converting to Christianity in the seventh and eighth centuries. As they were baptised by immersion in Britain's rivers, many felt a dilemma. While they were profoundly taken with their newly acquired faith, they recognised that as occupiers of a foreign country they might have to engage in battle. As they went under the water, some kept their right arms above the water. They were saying, in effect, 'You can have all of me Lord, save for my sword arm. I need to keep ownership of that for myself - I may need it someday.' While Christians in the twenty-first century don't need to keep their sword arms above the waters of baptism, there are many who metaphorically hold their wallets above the water. Martin Luther once said, 'There are three conversions necessary: the conversion of the heart, the mind and the purse.'"

Weekly Home Groups

Lent is a time for looking at Jesus and his teaching and for looking at ourselves and considering our response to his call on our lives. This year the Diocese has encouraged us to think about our faith in a Generous God and our call to be Generous People. In response we would like to suggest all those that can take part in a four week Lent study in a house group.

If you are unable to join us in a house group – then there are other ways of joining in – you can download the study course from our website https://carlfordchurches.org/lent-2019/ to pursue in your own time.

You may also like to take part in a short daily reading and reflection which we will email to you each day. By doing so you'll be sent a short bible passage and reflection each day from Ash Wednesday to Easter. - develop friendships and understanding of each other's lives and experiences
- pray for each other
- grow in faith as we learn from one another
- share our resources because of our friendship

Kagera, in northwest Tanzania, is a beautiful region, mostly of steeply hilled savannah country. However it is poor and remote. Its 1 million people typically live on less than £1 a day, mostly through subsistence farming. Malaria and HIV/Aids are major problems. Parts of Kagera have some of the highest under-five mortality rates in the country. Lack of education and low capital investment in the area has led to a perception of poverty being the norm and to dependency on external aid.

The Bishops' Lent appeal this year will support our brothers and sisters in Kagera with education in its many forms to enable them to raise their people out of a mindset of dependency to self sufficiency. The funds raised will support priests, subsistence farmers and young people, and empower them to build a more hopeful future. The vision of Kagera Diocese is 'Life in its fullness' (John 10:10) and through the link we can help them achieve it.



2019 Bishop's Lent appeal for Kagera: Educating for self-sufficiency

Help young people build a better future

Kagera has one of the lowest levels of literacy in Tanzania. The Diocese has set up both a primary school and a secondary school in the town of Ngara, close to the Diocesan headquarters.

We are helping finance the building of dormitory accommodation at Ngara Anglican Primary School (NAPS). Further building work is needed including improved kitchen and dining facilities, a new library, and guttering and tanks for rainwater collection.

The Diocese is also active in state schools. It has developed a bible knowledge course which is being used in secondary schools across the region, delivered by parish priests and lay workers. The course has been so successful that it has been taken up by other dioceses in Tanzania.

The Diocese also runs Sunday Schools and youth work in most of the churches in Kagera.



NAPS provides high quality primary education in English. In 2018 the final year pupils achieved the best results for the whole of Kagera region, 12th out of over 3000 schools in the country.

Help farmers survive climate change

Climate change is having a huge impact in Kagera. Where once the rainy seasons came regularly each year, now they are unpredictable. After months without rain there can be torrential downpours, washing away whatever crops have been planted. This can be devastating for a subsistence farmer, depending on his or her land for food to eat. And that's over 70% of the population of Kagera. Because of climate change, farming methods that have been used for generations are no longer working.

The Church and Community Mobilisation Process (CCMP) is a Diocesan project to encourage self sufficiency. Money raised in the 2017 appeal is supporting the core work of CCMP until 2020. With money raised in this year's appeal we can help fund:

- · training in new farming methods
- · obtaining new seed varieties



Using a loan from his Pamoja self-help group set up by CCMP, Majaliwa now grows passion fruit to sell at market. The money he earned has made a huge difference to him and his family, and he is now a CCMP facilitator for his district.

Help priests lead their people out of poverty

Priests in Kagera are known as pastors – shepherds. They lead their people not only spiritually but also in practical ways. Pastors need support in this holistic ministry, to motivate and lead their communities out of poverty to 'Life in its fullness.'

Pastors are paid by their local churches. In Nyamteke village the collection raises around £4 each week and the pastor receives just 20% of this.

The Lent appeal can help:

- Kagera Theological Training College (KCTC), provide training for lay leaders and a diploma course leading to ordination
- pastors with their expenses including medical insurance and children's school fees
- parishes with funds to set up projects to improve their communities



Pastor Amon is a leader in his church of Nyakayanja. He is teaching his congregation about CCMP to encourage them to plant trees, establish self-help groups, and work for the improvement of their community.
