## “What do you say after you say Hello?”

What do you say after you say Hello?

What does Jesus tell his followers to do?

*As you go preach the message: The kingdom of Heaven is near. Heal the sick, raise the dead. Cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received, freely give.*



My father always spoke about the weather and the conversation usually went on to things he had been doing, the garden, dealing with various pests on the allotment and DIY. By the age of sixteen I realised that Dad was not too hot at DIY, so we did various projects together; me taking the lead, climbing onto the roof or putting my arm down the drain – a clever man my father. Everyone said my Dad was good to talk to, a very shy man he listened to what other people were saying and eventually the talk would come around to events in church, various choirs, suppers, talks or simple get togethers in the village. My parents were no evangelists, but it was natural for both of them to share what they were doing and invite other people along.

Rural North Devon was a slow-moving place and you had to take the trouble to get to know people before they would listen or take on new ideas. As a teenager with the Methodists I thought the future was standing in the market square telling people the kingdom has come, telling people to repent and believe the good news that Jesus has come into the world to save sinners.

In my first year as a curate wearing a dog collar I have met many people who are ill, a good number who are experiencing loss, some people who have mental health issues, some who have reached the point where life itself has little meaning. The greatest challenge I imagined would be indifference, but I have been welcomed into homes, hospital

wards and approached to help in many different ways. I have learnt to listen to individuals and not to rush in with advice. My job for forty years had been giving people honest advice, spelling out their options and encouraging good practice in the way adults work with children. My role now is to help people come into the kingdom. My task is not to create the kingdom, push or pull but to acknowledge that I have been freely given in so many ways. I want to share the joy I find in Christ with others.

So, what do I say after I say hello? This can be tricky.

I remember asking my good friend Matthew Ling, who as a curate was good at coming alongside people in hospital – what did Matthew do if the person he was visiting was too ill to interact? What did Matthew do after he said Hello? Matthew’s answer was so straight forward and so intuitively honest, hopeful and true that I have followed his lead ever since. Whether the person is in pain, awake or asleep I now simply ask if I can read a Psalm and pray with the person I visit. Sometimes individuals chose their favourite Psalm, a saying of Jesus or they even ask me what some passage of scripture means? Nobody has yet asked me who Cain married or even asked me if I see the Bible as myth – maybe they are too polite ... but they are concerned about family feuds, reconciliation and the future of children after divorce. Very ill people long to put their house in order, heal old wounds and find peace.

This Autumn there are plenty of opportunities to invite friends and family along to coffee mornings and get together in the Carlford Benefice as churches we need to be planning now, asking Jesus who he is asking us to invite to come with us to the many places we meet - homes, churches, church rooms. If the harvest of men and women is to be reaped, we all have work to do in the harvest fields. If I fail to stop you and say Hello, stop me and greet me on the road. I am the lost looking elderly man in a dog collar trying to find an address in your village. I may be looking for you.

## IF YOU HAVE COMMENTS TO MAKE ABOUT THE IPSWICH NORTHERN ROUTE BUT DO NOT HAVE ACCESS TO A COMPUTER

Suffolk County Council, at the request of the Parish Council have placed some information concerning the Ipswich Northern Route Consultation in St Mary's Church, Grundisburgh. There are also copies of the questionnaire, for those without online access, to fill in for posting into the box provided to be collected by the County Council. The Parish Council have put some copies in Williams to widen the availability.

A very well attended extraordinary meeting of Grundisburgh & Culpho Parish Council in St Marys Church last Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> August returned a 95% indication against all the routes proposed.

So, the Parish Council feel justified in warning anyone filling in the questionnaire to please be aware that it has been designed by statisticians. If you are against all the Northern Routes put forward in the consultation, please follow the Stop Campaign information available in filling out the questionnaire.

The consultation period **ENDS** on September 13<sup>th</sup> all questionnaires must reach the County Council before that date.

**CITIZENS ADVICE – HERE TO HELP!**

Leiston Citizens Advice gives free advice, help and support to hundreds of people throughout East Suffolk every year. We advise across a wide range of issues including benefits, debt and money, employment, housing, consumer problems, utility issues, relationships and family problems.

On an everyday basis our advisers help clients make and manage benefit applications, including Universal Credit, and advise on benefit appeals. We support and help clients through managing and dealing with their debts, and we guide clients through the issues they face when relationships break down, or they face separation or divorce. We are there to help in emergencies when people become homeless, are escaping abuse or have nothing to eat. We are also the first point of contact for people who have a consumer problem, for example, with repairs or something they have bought.

The majority of Citizens Advice advisers are trained volunteers. In our East Suffolk Leiston office volunteers have the back up of a small group of paid staff - a manager, two supervisors and a dedicated money advice specialist and assistant. Our main office is in Leiston and we hold outreach sessions in Woodbridge, Saxmundham, Aldeburgh, Wickham Market, Alderton and Framlingham. We work from GP surgeries, libraries, children's centres and community centres in an effort to reach isolated communities and address poor public transport in the rural areas of Suffolk.

Anyone who needs to contact us can drop in – no appointment necessary. Our Leiston office is open on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between 10am and 2pm. Our outreach offices are open at different times throughout the week – for information phone 01728 832193 or check [www.leistoncab.org](http://www.leistoncab.org) for venues and times.

Finally, a word about Citizens Advice volunteers. Citizens Advice is always looking for new volunteers, including to help with fund-raising. ## Beyond Belief Autumn 2019

### What do we really know about these Bible topics ...?

We are a small group which gives us the opportunity to discuss areas of Christian Faith at six meetings held at **GRUNDISBURGH PARISH ROOMS, 10.30-12.00**

Sessions are fortnightly on **Monday September 30<sup>th</sup>; October 14<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>; November 11<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>, December 9<sup>th</sup>**. People of faith, agnostics, and atheists, all are very welcome.

Tea or coffee and a piece of cake will be available and a warm welcome to all. A small charge of £1 per person, per session, covers costs.

### We will consider – What do we really know about ...

#### Session 1 – September 30<sup>th</sup>

**Biblical Topic – ppt. Presentation 1: 'Jesus the Jew'** – What kind of Jew was Jesus? What did the various Jewish sects believe? Did one sect have a greater influence on his teachings? Were the Jewish religious groups his enemies?

**References:** John 4:1-26; Matthew 15:1-20; Matthew 16:1-12; Mark 3:1-6;

#### Session 2 – October 14<sup>th</sup>

**Biblical Topic – Discussion 1: 'What is SIN?'** – Is there more than one definition of sin? What does it mean when Genesis implies Adam and Eve sinned? How does sin affect the world? Could Jesus sin? Did sin stop after Jesus's crucifixion?

**References:** Genesis chapter 3; Romans chapters 5-8; 1 Corinthians chapter 15; 1 John chapters 1-5;

#### Session 3 – October 28<sup>th</sup>

**Biblical Topic – ppt. Presentation 2: 'Can Truth be Heresy?'** – What is Heresy? What is Truth? Does religious truth change? Has the Bible's truth changed? How does one become a heretic?

**References:** John 8:32; John 14:6; 1 Timothy 2:7; Titus 3; 2 John 1:1-13; John 4:21-26;

#### Session 4 – November 11<sup>th</sup>

**Biblical Topic – Discussion 2: 'The Trinity'** – What is the definition of Trinity? Did Jesus's apostles and disciples believe in a Trinity? When was the Christian Trinity first believed?

**References:** Genesis 1:26 & 3:22; John 10:30; John 14:9-14; John 20:28;

#### Session 5 – November 25<sup>th</sup>
